What is a cell group?

Hebrews 10:24-25

1. Let us consider one another.
2. To stir up one another to love and good works.
3. Not neglecting, but encouraging.

Fellowship is one of the great words of the New Testament: it denotes something that is vital to a Christian's spiritual health, and central to the Church's true life... The church will flourish and Christians will be strong only when there is fellowship.

What is a cell group?

A gathering of 6-14 people, led by trained lay-leaders, that meet in one another's homes to build relationships, encourage one another in spiritual growth, care for one another personally, and serve inside and outside the group.

Cell Group Distinctives

- Less than 14 in size
- Balance relational and spiritual growth
- Meet at least twice per month
- Led by trained lay-leaders who receive on-going support
- Committed to Multiplication
- Committed to developing new leaders through apprenticeship

3 Levels of Ministry

- Congregation - Proclamation and Celebration
- Modules - Education
- Cell - Application and Personal Ministry
